Our February meeting featured a presentation by Joe Clegg about his time working in California on the Space Shuttle in the 1980's. He created a Power Point slide presentation and told us about a lot about the inner shuttle workings, and some of the engineering problems he helped solve. As a person who has been through the Kennedy Space Center twice, Mission Control in Houston once, and seen one space shuttle launch (3<sup>rd</sup> to last) up pretty close, I found Joe's talk very interesting and informative.

The program for our March meeting has not yet been decided. Karen says she is working on it. Your editor is no help. I didn't create a new aviation Power Pilot presentation for 2018 so I have nothing to try out on the unsuspecting FFFA membership.

#### **News of the Freeman Army Airfield Museum**



The Freeman Army Airfield Museum is a completely separate entity from the Freeman Field Flying Association. Some of our board members (L. Bothe &

B. Grant) overlap. The FFFA on occasion supports the museum with gifts of money for worthy projects.

The museum is pleased to welcome Tim O'Connor as our newest board member. Tim replaces Allen Morrison, who found himself too busy with work and family obligations to continue with the museum.

We are very busy with 3 projects to enhance visitor experience. Here's a quick recap of the status of those projects.

Room usage changes: Our room changes nearing completion. Basically, swapped chairs and movie screen out of the Library Room and put them in the Diorama Room, with the pull-down movie screen in front of the diorama. With the chairs out of the library we were able to move the glass display cases in the entry room down to the library. That in turn allowed us to expand our gift shop area. And now, when a group comes, we can have them step right into the diorama room and show our introductory video. We no longer have to try to herd them down the hall to the library.

**Book cataloging:** All the real hard-cover books are entered into the library software. The 91 wartime issues of Life Magazine we have are sorted and placed in protective sleeves. Now we're dealing with all the other stuff (big mess!) that has accumulated in the library over time.

**Flight simulator:** The simulator project is moving forward at a decent pace. We raised enough money to do the project. Our used gaming computer has been brought up to speed and will do the job. The video card that will operate the 3 monitors necessary for a wrap-around view has been installed. So has the simulation software. Next we need to buy three 27" monitors. Then we order the remaining aircraft control modules (control yoke, rudder pedals, etc.) and put it all together.

The museum was fortunate to receive a grant from the Seymour Redevelopment Commission that allows us to make three important capital improvements. In 2018 we will pave the driveway at the annex building where the fire truck goes in and out, put a 100%-flake epoxy coating on the annex floor, and replace the ancient carpet in about half of our main building. We also expect to get two engines from the National Air & Space Museum. 2018 is shaping up to be a very good year for the museum.
