Star Party, Airport Briefly Closed 4/13

Freeman Field will be closed on Saturday evening, 4/13, from approximately 5:00 PM until midnight. Rain date is 4/20. There will be a "Star Party" sponsored by an astronomy group from Louisville (with a strong Seymour following). The public will be invited to view the heavens through telescopes that will be set up on the center, north-south, taxiway. The museum will be open from 5:30 until 8:00 that evening as an added attraction for the public to visit.

After the great painting project of January and February, things seem rather subdued. Thank God, we couldn't stay at that level of intensity all year. Our attention is now turned to several smaller projects that got put aside during the paint work.

The project to put LED lights in the *Edged Weapons of WW-II* display case was completed this past Saturday. It turned out to be less complicated than we originally thought. Once in a while we get off easy.

The project to restore the fire truck fuel system to its original stock configuration is nearly completed. The reconditioned gas tank and overhauled mechanical fuel pump are installed. Next the new copper fuel line gets put in place. We'll be ready to run for the 2019 parade and car show season.

We are working on an imaginary window in a depression in the south wall of the annex, where a real window used to be. When museum visitors look "out" of our imaginary window they will see a scene, in color, of the airplane ramp from the foreign aircraft evaluation period (right after the war). We have the wooden window, the scene, and the

LED lights. The window frame needs to be refinished, the "scene" properly mounted on foam-core board, and then the whole thing can be assembled, with LED lighting.

The museum had a fire inspection on March 7th. It was all good except for several extension cords that had to be eliminated or changed to long-cord plug strips with surge suppressors. We learned that permanently-installed extensions cords are not allowed. All the discrepancies have been corrected and the inspector was back on 3/16 and signed us off. Now that we know about the extension cord rule we shouldn't have any problems in the future.

Glider Operation Information

The Louisville Soaring Club would like aircraft flying at SER to know that the gliders almost always operate off runways 14/32, and usually on weekends. However, that does not mean that the wind favors 14 or 32. The gliders and tow plane use 14/32 because it is convenient to where the gliders are stored. All the gliders have radios. When approaching the field, especially on weekends, call addressing Seymour Glider Operation and ask where the gliders are; they will tell you. It actually works best, when glider operations are in progress, for power planes to use 5 or 23. FMI www.soarky.org, or call President Bob Walker at 502-314-3519.
